## Minutes of Meeting of Board of Directors of Deerfield Village Property Owner's Association

Per his email, Jim has submitted the application for the CommunitTree grant. If we are approved, we should be planting 25 trees in mid-October. There was a discussion about the large number of Golden Delicious trees that are dying. The red apple trees seem to be holding their own as they are somewhat more resistant to the blight. Paul offered to contact Scott at the mulch plant to see if they would be interested in removing the old trees and use them at their plant.

Debbie was not able to study the Arboreal Policy so this will be on the agenda for the August meeting. There was no other New Business.
